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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is a practical course at an Advanced level that develops competence in the English language while helping students succeed in the planned objectives from IO-5450. The instructor is responsible for preparing appropriate materials that the course requires and also creating effective evaluations for the works created by the students.

COURSE CONTENTS:

A diverse selection of topics will be heard throughout the TOEFL anthology found within a variety of **short and long conversations, casual conversations, and academic discussions** as well as **lectures**.

METODOLOGÍA

The instructor will use a TOEFL based audio arsenal to help students refine their aural skills in English. Student participation in class is vital as he/she is responsible for listening, repeating, comprehending, reproducing, explaining what was heard, defining vocabulary terms, summing up a lecture, analyzing what was heard and seen, etc.

NOTE: This is a lab course in which attendance is mandatory. Any absence must be justified with a certified doctor's note. Any unjustified absence will result in the loss of the course.

Metodología: La profesora utilizará material de audio del TOEFL para ayudar a los y las estudiantes a agudizar sus destrezas auditivas en inglés. La participación de los y las estudiantes es vital para el desarrollo de las clases y por ende las y los mismos son responsables de escuchar, repetir, comprender, reproducir, explicar lo escuchado, definir términos del vocabulario, resumir lo escuchado, analizar lo escuchado y observado, etc.

NOTA: los cursos de laboratorio son de asistencia obligatoria. Cualquier ausencia debe ser justificada con un certificado médico. Cualquier ausencia injustificada implica que el o la estudiante pierda el curso.
