I. Descripción del curso

El curso LM-1001 Inglés Integrado I es propio de las carreras de Bachillerato en Inglés y Bachillerato en la Enseñanza del Inglés. Este es un curso semestral preparado para estudiantes principiantes con conocimientos básicos. Está orientado hacia la integración de las cuatro macro-destrezas (la auditiva, la oral, la escrita y la lectura), así como las micro-destrezas (e.g. pronunciación, vocabulario y gramática). LM-1001 es un curso holístico de tipo comunicativo dentro de un enfoque académico. Dos profesores se encargarán de impartir las lecciones. LM-1001 le proporciona al estudiante los conocimientos y destrezas necesarios para poder enfrentarse a un contenido con un mayor nivel de dificultad en el curso LM-1002 Inglés Integrado II. Al finalizar el curso el estudiante podrá expresarse apropiadamente de forma oral y escrita a un nivel intermedio bajo.

II. Objetivos específicos

Al finalizar el curso el estudiante será capaz de cumplir con los siguientes objetivos a un nivel intermedio bajo de inglés:

- 1. Entender conversaciones básicas relacionadas con los temas de cada unidad.
- **2.** Expresarse apropiadamente en conversaciones de tipo social y académico relacionadas con los temas del curso de manera fluida.
- **3.** Comprender textos de lectura relacionados con los temas estudiados en clase utilizando diferentes técnicas de lectura.
- **4.** Escribir párrafos de diversos tipos (e.g. descriptivos, comparativos) acerca de los temas estudiados en clase mediante el uso de estrategias (e.g. lluvia de ideas, escritura libre, esquematización de ideas).
- **5.** Discutir aspectos generales de la cultura angloparlante.
- **6.** Expresar sus sentimientos y opiniones sobre diferentes temas en forma oral y escrita, incorporando estructuras gramaticales y vocabulario apropiado.
- 7. Utilizar estrategias básicas de autocorrección.

IV. Metodología

Los docentes serán facilitadores de la acción comunicativa en la clase, es decir, que las actividades se centrarán en la participación activa de los estudiantes. La destreza oral se desarrollará por medio de conversaciones y discusiones a un nivel intermedio bajo. La destreza auditiva se fortalecerá por medio del trabajo con material de audio que acompaña el libro de texto, así como el preparado por los docentes. Los docentes utilizarán textos con el fin de que los alumnos comprendan su contenido mediante la puesta en práctica de diversas estrategias de lectura.

Los estudiantes desarrollarán la expresión escrita y recibirán retroalimentación. Los temas se desarrollarán a través de una amplia variedad de técnicas de trabajo individual, en parejas, y en grupo. Los docentes darán explicaciones del contenido gramatical y se realizarán los ejercicios gramaticales de los folletos correspondientes. Se enfatizará la pronunciación correcta de aspectos como las terminaciones –s, -es y el pasado de los verbos regulares. Los estudiantes deberán practicar con sus compañeros fuera de clase, además de realizar las tareas asignadas. En el laboratorio de cómputo los estudiantes podrán hacer uso de los programas educativos y los sitios de Internet que los docentes consideren necesarios.

Notas importantes:

- **1.** Cada examen oral se hará con dos docentes. El examen oral consiste en el desarrollo de conversaciones relacionadas con el contenido del curso, así como preguntas individuales.

ARTÍCULO 24. Esta solicitud debe presentarla ante el profesor que imparte el curso, adjuntando la documentación y las razones por las cuales no pudo efectuar la prueba, con el fin de que el profesor determine, en los tres días hábiles posteriores a la presentación de la solicitud, si procede una reposición. Si ésta procede, el profesor deberá fijar la fecha de reposición, la cual no podrá establecerse en un plazo menor de cinco días hábiles contados a partir del momento en que el estudiante se reintegre normalmente a sus estudios. Son justificaciones: la muerte de un pariente hasta de segundo grado, la enfermedad del estudiante u otra situación de fuerza mayor o caso fortuito. En caso de rechazo, esta decisión podrá ser apelada ante la dirección de la unidad académica en los cinco días hábiles posteriores a la notificación del rechazo, según lo establecido en este Reglamento.

- 5. En este curso no hay posibilidad de eximirse de los exámenes finales.
- 6. Todo estudiante en todo curso queda sujeto a los reglamentos de la Universidad de Costa Rica.
